

Lesson # 10 -- God's Supply in a Glorification and its Anticipation.

Introduction

A. The believer's future is described in the most glorious terms possible.
Note Revelation 21 and 22.

B. This lesson is concerned with the glorification of the believer and facets related to his glorification. Because of this the eschatological events of the return of Jesus Christ are not particularly emphasized.

I. The Comfort Related to the Believer's Glorification.

A. John 14:1-4 -- He will come and receive you.

B. I Cor. 15:45-58 -- He will abolish your death and give you victory of incorruption and immortality.

C. Philippians 3:21 -- He will change even your body to be like His.

D. I Thess. 4:13-18 -- He will call you into His presence to be there forever.

E. I Peter 1:3-7,13 -- He Who is keeping you now will return to reward you and give you the inheritance.

F. I John 2:28; 3:2 -- He will come for you and you will be like Him.

G. Rev. 21:1-7; 22:1-5 -- He will make all things new and include you in His glorious provision.

II. The Warnings Related to the Believer's Glorification.

A. Luke 12:35-48 -- We may be unprepared and irresponsible.

B. Luke 19:11-27 -- We may be found unprofitable servants.

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C. Romans 14:10-13 -- We may be found guilty of judging our brother.

D. I Cor. 3:11-15 -- We may have works that will be burned.

E. I John 2:28 -- We may be ashamed before Him.

III. The Instruction Related to the Believer's Glorification.

A. Luke 12:35-48 -- Be ready for His coming.

B. Luke 19:11-27 -- Be fruitful with His gifts.

C. I Thess. 5:1-11 -- Be serious about living for Him.

D. I Peter 1:6,7 -- Be steadfast in trials.

E. II Peter 3:8-14 -- Be holy in daily life.

F. I John 2:28 -- Be submissive to Jesus Christ.

G. Rev. 22:7,12 -- Be obedient to God's Word.

Conclusion
