

Prayers and Praying

The Purpose of This Study: The Christian is one who can pray. This provision of God is one of the greatest privileges ever given to the believer. Our endeavor, in this study, is to be taught by the Holy Spirit, so that we may more fully understand this privilege of prayer, learn how to pray more Biblically and thereby be motivated and enabled to pray more successfully. The True and Living God is worthy of our worship, adoration, love and trust.

Recommendation: Spend at least one-half hour a day studying the Scripture and the lesson. Pray for illumination about character defects, sins of omission and commission and giving ground to Satan. Be honest. Accept the truth and obey God. Apply the material to specific details of the daily life in the practice of faith, love and hope. Take time to pray and expect God to transform you.

Comment: This study is simply a sample of the Biblical material related to prayer. Due to the limitation of time two of the greatest passages regarding prayer, the so-called Lord's Prayer and the prayers of the Lord Jesus Christ in Gethsemane, have not been included.
