#### Introduction

- A. God has not left us in our self-chosen ignorance. He has revealed Himself to us in His work of creation, His work through the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Scripture.
- B. It is important to recognize that revelation and authority stand or fall together. To accept divine revelation means we have a secure foundation for all facets of science, art, education, morality, spirituality, and every area of life.
- C. By "authority" I mean:
  - 1. We have the ability and sources to find out what we are to believe and do.
  - 2. That we have the right to believe and practice these beliefs.
  - 3. The confidence that what we believe and do is based in reality.
  - 4. The certainty that if we put revelation into practice we will be successful.

# I. The Nature of Our Father's Disclosure.

- A. The disclosure in creation: general revelation.
  - 1. General revelation may be defined as: God's disclosure through



- 1). V1. The words "declare" and "proclaim" are participles = continuous action.
- 2). V1. The word "glory" indicates the sum total of God's revealed perfections and the word "work" speaks of His exquisite workmanship.
- 3). This disclosure of God is explained in three ways.
  - a). V2—The revelation of God is perpetual
  - b). V3—The revelation of God is wordless.
  - c). V4—The revelation of God is universal.
- 4). The recognition of general and special revelation.
  - a). Vs 1-6—the name "God" (Elohim) is used = God as all-powerful Creator.
  - b). Vs 7-14—the name LORD (Yahweh) is used = God as loving Redeemer.
- b. Luke 12:47,48;
  - 47 "That servant who knows his master's will and does not get ready or does not do what his master wants will be beaten with many blows. 48 But the one who does not know and does things deserving punishment will be beaten with few blows. —presents general revelation as a basis for human responsibility. We are responsible for what we should know and not only for what we know. This principle also applies to special revelation.

- B. The Disclosure in the Lord Jesus: special revelation.
  - Jesus Christ is the "Word" of God—as recorded and explained in the Scripture. Note these verses:

Matt 24:35;

35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away.
NIV

Luke 6:47-49;

47 I will show you what he is like who comes to me and hears my words and puts them into practice. 48 He is like a man building a house, who dug down deep and laid the foundation on rock. When a flood came, the torrent struck that house but could not shake it, because it was well built. 49 But the one who hears my words and does not put them into practice is like a man who built a house on the ground without a foundation. The moment the torrent struck that house, it collapsed and its destruction was complete."

b. It is personal:

d. It is authoritative:

# II. The Content of Our Father's Disclosure.

A. He has revealed His greatness regarding Himself.

Ex 3:12-14,

- 12 And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain."
- 13 Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?"
- 14 God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"
  NIV

## Ex 6:3;

3 I appeared to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob as God Almighty, but by my name the LORD I did not make myself known to them.
NIV

# Ex 33:18-23;

- 18 Then Moses said, "Now show me your glory."
- 19 And the LORD said, "I will cause all my goodness to pass in front of you, and I will proclaim my name, the LORD, in your presence. He is infinitely great as personal (the trinity), spirit, the source of all life, self-existent, and immutable. He is the one God of truth, love and holiness.

B. He has revealed His greatness regarding His creation.

#### Isaiah 40:12-31

- 12 Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, or with the breadth of his hand marked off the heavens? Who has held the dust of the earth in a basket, or weighed the mountains on the scales and the hills in a balance?
- 13 Who has understood the mind of the LORD, or instructed him as his counselor?
- 14 Whom did the LORD consult to enlighten him, and who taught him the right way?
  Who was it that taught him knowledge or showed him the path of understanding?
- 15 Surely the nations are like a drop in a bucket; they are regarded as dust on the scales; he weighs the islands as though they were fine dust.
- 16 Lebanon is not sufficient for altar fires, nor its animals enough for burnt offerings.
- 17 Before him all the nations are as nothing; they are regarded by him as worthless and less than nothing.
- 18 To whom, then, will you compare God? What image will you compare him to?

- 19 As for an idol, a craftsman casts it, and a goldsmith overlays it with gold and fashions silver chains for it.
- 20 A man too poor to present such an offering selects wood that will not rot.

  He looks for a skilled craftsman to set up an idol that will not topple.
- 21 Do you not know?
  Have you not heard?
  Has it not been told you from the beginning?
  Have you not understood since the earth was founded?
- 22 He sits enthroned above the circle of the earth, and its people are like grasshoppers.

  He stretches out the heavens like a canopy, and spreads them out like a tent to live in.
- 23 He brings princes to naught and reduces the rulers of this world to nothing.
- 24 No sooner are they planted, no sooner are they sown, no sooner do they take root in the ground, than he blows on them and they wither, and a whirlwind sweeps them away like chaff.
- 25 "To whom will you compare me? Or who is my equal?" says the Holy One.
- 26 Lift your eyes and look to the heavens: Who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one, and calls them each by name. Because of his great power and mighty strength, not one of them is missing.
- 27 Why do you say, O Jacob, and complain, O Israel, "My way is hidden from the LORD; my cause is disregarded by my God"?
- 28 Do you not know?
  Have you not heard?
  The LORD is the everlasting God,
  the Creator of the ends of the earth.

He is infinitely great regarding time in that He is eternal; regarding space in His immensity; regarding power in His omnipotence; regarding knowledge in His omniscience; regarding relationships in His omnipresence.

C. He has revealed His greatness regarding moral beings.

Ex 34:6;

6 And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The LORD, the LORD, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, NIV

Jer 10:10

10 But the LORD is the true God; he is the living God, the eternal King. When he is angry, the earth trembles; the nations cannot endure his wrath. NIV

He is infinitely great as the source and standard of all truth and faithfulness; as the source and standard of all holiness and justice; as the source and standard of all love and goodness.

Conclusion: Ask God to give you the Holy Spirit and open the "eyes of your heart."

See Eph 1:17,18.

17 I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. 18 I pray also that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in the saints, NIV

Depend upon Him each day to do so as you read His Word.
