Introduction

- A. Christianity has been designed by God to "work."
- B. God expects you to know His will, generally and specifically; He expects you to obey Him and do His will; and, He expects you to make a success out of life.
- I. The Meaning of the Will of God: To Glorify God.
 - A. The Scripture: I. Cor. 6:20' 10:31; Col. 3:17; I Peter 4:11.
 - B. The Explanation:

The will of God and the goal of glorifying God extends to all areas of life.

- II. The Achievement of the Will of God: All believers are "Called."
 - A. The inescapable nature of the call, Romans 11:29.
 - B. The fact of the call, Romans 8:28; II Timothy 1:8-11.
 - C. The objective of the call of God, Romans 8:29.
 - D. Observations:
 - 1. Believers are "called" into all areas of legitimate work.
 - 2. There is no division of "secular" and "sacred" work.
 - 3. There is no hierarchy in the church where some are "called" and other believers are not..
- III. Requirements for Knowing God's Will Specifically: An Honest Willingness.
 - A. The Scripture: John 7:17; 16:13; Romans 12:1,2
 - B. The Explanation:

If the believer honestly wants to know the will of God-so he can obediently serve God-then he will know. That is God's premise!

- IV. Conditions for Fulfilling God's Will: Fellowship, Liberty, Holiness.
 - A. God expects us to live in fellowship with Himself, I Cor. 1:9.
 - B. God expects us to maintain the liberty given in salvation, Gal. 5:13.
 - C. God expects us to live holy lives, I Thess. 4:3:7.
