THE BELIEVER'S TWOFOLD RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

Introduction

- A. The puzzle: The Bible describes the believer as "clean" (John 15:3) and yet he is to "cleanse himself" (II Cor. 7:1), as "holy" (Eph. 1:4) and yet he is to "be holy" (I Pet. 1:15). How can we explain this seeming enigma?
- B. The Answer: All believers have a twofold relationship with God--salvation and sanctification.
 - 1. The salvation relationship is the believer's standing before God. It is a perfect relationship. The believer is "complete" in Christ.

And ye are complete in Him, which is the head of all principality and power. Col. 2:10

The sanctification relationship is the believer's state before God. It is always in the process of development. The believer is exhorted to "grow."

As newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the Word, that ye may grow thereby. I Pet. 2:2

I. THE BELIEVER'S STANDING BEFORE AND AFTER SALVATION

Before Salvation

Once Unclean (Isa. 64:6)

But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags . . .

Once Dead to God (Eph. 2:1)

And you hath He quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins.

Once Guilty (Rom. 3:23)

For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God.

Once Unrigteous (Rom. 3:10)

As it is written, There is none righteous, no, not one.

Once Enslaved to Satan (Eph. 2:2)

Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air

After Salvation

Now Cleansed (Isa. 1:18)

Come now and let us reason together, saith the Lord, though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow

Now Alive to God (Eph. 2:1)

And you hath He quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins.

Now Forgiven (Col. 2:23b)

. . . having forgiven you all trespasses.

Now Righteous (Rom. 5:1)

Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God

Now Free From Satan (Col. 1:13)

Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness and hath translated us into the kingdom of His dear Son.
