Introduction

- A. The Christian is one who has been given priceless possessions.
- B. The Bible describes this wonderful relationship by the statement "blessed by God." All of us would treasure a gift from a king. We have been gifted by God!
- C. All Christians have the same possessions. Many of us, however, do not know our possession
-- and sad to say -- many of us do not live in harmony with them.

I. The Truth Silted: The Christian Has Possessions.

- B. The Christian is Forgiven, Colossians 2:13.

And you, being dead in your sins and the uncircumcision of your flesh, hath He quickened together with Him, having forgiven you all trespasses.

- C. The Christian is Protected, Ephesians 1:13,14.

In Whom ye also trusted, after than ye heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; in Whom also after that ye believed, ye were sealed with that Holy Spirit of promise, which is the earnest of our inheritance unto the redemption of the purchased possession, unto the praise of His glory.

- D. The Christian is Justified, Romans 5:1.

Therefore, being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

- E. The Christian is Absolved, Romans 8:1.

There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

- F. The Christian is Sanctified, Jude 1.

G. The Christian is Preserved, Jude 1.
